Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Section 7: Handling and Storage

Precautions for Safe Handling

Avoid contact with skin and eyes. Avoid breathing processing vapor or mist. Wash thoroughly after handling. Emptied container retains vapor and product residue. Observe all labeled safeguards until container is cleaned, reconditioned or destroyed. For precautions see section 2.

Conditions for Safe Storage, Including any Incompatibilities

Store out of direct sunlight in a cool well-ventilated place. Keep stabilizer levels constant to avoid explosive polymerization. An air space is required above the liquid in all containers; avoid storage under an oxygen free atmosphere. Inhibitor levels should be maintained- the typical shelf-life for this product is 6 months.

Store separate from: Strong oxidizing agents, Strong reducing agents, Free radical generators, Inert gas, Oxygen scavenger, peroxides

Appropriate Engineering Controls

Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety practice. Investigate engineering techniques to reduce exposures. Provide ventilation if necessary to minimize exposures. Handle with gloves. Gloves must be inspected prior to use. Use proper glove removal technique (without touching glove's outer surface) to avoid skin contact with this product. Dispose of contaminated gloves after use in accordance with applicable laws and good laboratory practices. Wash and dry hands.
