Store out of direct sunlight in a cool well-ventilated place. Keep stabilizer levels constant to avoid explosive polymerization. An air space is required above the liquid in all containers; avoid storage under an oxygen free atmosphere. Inhibitor levels should be maintained- the typical shelf-life for this product is 6 months.
